To the above total of the ships' companies are to be added 760 marines, which, with the complement of the storeships, officers, celentific corps, and others attached to the expedition, will make an effective force of 4000 men and above 880 gunt, mosily heavy ordnance. The steamers are each to mount a couple of Patishan abell guns of the largest callbre, and phaced on revolving trucks, so as to sweep the horizon.--Three guns are intended to be used for the discharge of shells of 88 and 120 Ha. each, and long 45%, making 32 guts to each steamer.

Each ship is provided with two brass 24 lb. field pieces, to be used for shells or canister shot. Philadelphia Ledger.
